Where: Iquitos, Peru & Amazon Jungle

- Iquitos, Peru (Jardin Lodge operated by Citadel alumni Todd Garrett)
 - Lodge nearby the famous Plaza de Armas (main square) in the heart of Iquitos.
 - Visit famous sites and markets in the exciting city of Iquitos, Peru known as the capital of the Amazon Jungle! A unique city in that it is the largest city inaccessible by road (surrounded by a sea of jungle). We will visit local sites (wildlife refuge centers, schools, zoos, markets)
- Amazon Research Center (2nd week of trip 06/05/19 06/13/19) operated by Amazonia Expeditions

 - Amazonia Expeditions (est. 1981) hosts student and research groups from around the world. Amazonia Expedition guides will lead daily hikes through the jungle and exploration of the Amazon River by boat. All supplies (boots, binoculars, etc.) provided. No vaccines regd.
 - Hike in the Amazon jungle via a trail system, explore the Amazon River by boat, observe primates, pink river dolphins, and more. Zipline through the forest canopy. Visit with local villages and schools.

Course Credits

- Earn a total of 6 credit hours PSYC 403 (Learning) and PSYC 463 (Special Topic: Field Studies in the Peruvian Amazon)
- Both courses (3 hours each) are a requirement and/or satisfy an elective for PSYC majors and minors!
- PSYC 463 as part of the course requirements, you will complete a team project either in the Amazon Jungle or when visiting local villages depending upon your interest. Present your research in a poster presentation at The Citadel's Library Day or during Spring Leadership Day (great for resumes, cover letters, graduate school applications, and experience!).
